I am happy to say that the membership is past where it was last year. The Restorer ad has brought in about ten members so far. I haven't had any response from members referring to the Model A News. We keep getting new members every now and then. I am including a new roster with this newsletter. The members at the end of the roster were received since the sheet was printed by Patti Jones. I have added these names. They are not alphabetically listed.

Right now we have 88 members.

As for our finances: I have spent a little over \$300.00 this year. This was for printing the newsletters, stamps and copies as well as stationary and paper and envelopes. I tried copying the bank book but it printed too light. The total we have now is \$506.77 but this will change with new members as well as what I spend for the next newsletter as well as two more newsletters this year. I spend a lot for copies as members request items such as Don Rosses' anticle on the Victoria seats, back newsletters etc. Of course, stamps are used up at a pretty good rate too. I usually write three or four letters a week. The bank book and money spent for operating, as listed above, is open for any of you to see at any time. I can have copies made for those of you that might want them even though the print is too light. I sent a copy to Mr. Roger Van Houten who will be at Virginia Beach and will conduct a Victoria meeting for those of you that attend this meet.

A lawyer friend of mine, Rosemany Zyne, made out the association papers in order that I could file with the IRS so we can operate as a non profit organization. Everything has been done and the papers have been filed and I am now waiting to hear what decision the IRS makes. Also, we are now affiliated with both MARC and MAFCA. Rosemany did not charge for her services. I thanked her for the association.

I am enclosing two sheets on body numbers versus motor numbers, one on Steelback and another on Leatherback Victorias. You can see that some members are missing motor numbers and some body numbers and some both. Also it clearly shows that some motors have been changed and do not fit the





sequence. If any of you see any mistakes, please let me know as well as sending any up-dated data so I can keep these two lists as up to date as I can. One other obvious item was that there are only four Leatherbacks with indented finewalls and they are mixed in with the non indented. Two are Oct. 30 and two Feb. 31 bodies. The Steelbacks are mixed in too and there seems to be no pattern. My May 31 can is only 75 numbers from Mr. Liable's can and mine is non indent and his is. There are several other May 31 body numbers and motor numbers that are fairly close and show the mixture of indent and non indent finewalls. We have some March 31 cars that have indent finewalls. Maybe if we get more data and numbers, we can arrive at a better idea of when the indent finewall really came out. I am open to your comments on this and any other ideas you will have. Please help if you can

Another enclosure to this newsletter is the Victoria Differences list. Marshall Lewis helped me with this list by adding what other cars have the same items. If any of you can help up date this list, please let me know.

I am enclosing another fine drawing by my friend Howard Barnes which is of the metal plate that is the front seat rear leg supports in the center. It supports both driver and passenger inner legs. I had Howard include a drawing of the rear foot for the front seats. This drawing was previously sent out but I had Howard do one for us so that we will wind up, eventually, with fine drawings by him of various parts for the Victoria. Let me know if you have any special desires, in the drawing area, you would like to see. I plan on asking Howard to do a drawing of the visors and visor brackets.

You will also notice that I have started using photos of the members cars. If you want your car photo in the newsletter, please send it to me.

I am in the process of checking this out and especially the differences. This might be just what we are looking for to settle any doubt of Murray and Briggs differences. 
I will send out the Vickie differences sheet as is, with Marshall Lewis' comments penned in Hopefully, in the next newsletter, I can add the information and send another to


Well, members, this is all for this time. Keep the letters, photos, questions and hopefully, information coming.


This two tone grey Vickie belongs to Ernie & Vi Kelley of Crescent, Okla. This is the only one that I have seen in this color scheme.





This green wheel, black body and tan top Leatherback Vickie belongs to Bob and Dottie Meyer of Cincinnati, Oh.


This 1931 Steelback Victoria belongs to Ennest & Wilma Smith of Munsten, Ind.




