This newsletter will include a new drawing by my friend Howard Barnes. This one is of the victoria sun visor bracket which Howard drew full size. You can obtain the Visors from LeBanon Bonney. The brackets are available from Mr. Venn Baken, 1902 Pickle Rd., Akron, Oh. 44321. Mr. Baken changes \$90 for a pain. These are excellent reproductions and Idoubt that even an expent can tell the difference. There is one catch, Mr. Baker only has three pair left and he will not make any more. Mr. Vagasky inquired of items we could suggest he make and I informed him that Mr. Baker was not going to make any more visor brackets and suggested that he bhackets. I'll let you know more on this if they inform me of such action. I hope so as I know there are many that would like to have the brackets. Also there are other model A's using the same bracket.



Another drawing I am enclosing is a tracing of the floor board metal cover above the steering wheel post where it goes through the floor. This metal plate isn't exactly the same as other model A's. I think it is the same on all the model A's that have the lowered steering wheel post such as the Victoria and A-400. If you need one, I suggest that you make a copy and take it with you to swap meets to try to locate. This tracing was sent in by Mr. Roger Van Houten. Roger graciously accepted the job of presiding over the Victoria meeting in Virginia Beach, Va.

Rogen conducted a fine meeting and reported that there were over 20 people in attendance. We picked up several members to our association at the meeting. One thing that came out of the meeting is that we still have no BRIGGS built Victorias that are verifiable in the association. All out Victorias to date are Murray built. I am including some rough sketches of the Leatherback rear window wood that was sent in by Mr. Dean Larson. I am also including four of the photos that he sent to me. I am embarrassed that I did this to him and I hope he will accept my apology. I hope the drawings and photos will be of help to some of you. Mr. Larson bought his wood from Norwood Products and had some problem with fit. He had to do some re-work of the rear window wood as well as to the top bows. Can any of you out there let us know where you might have purchased your wood and how it fit? Mr. Larson is not pleased with his re-work of the top bows so if you know where to get good fitting top bows for the Leatherback (and Steelback) let me know and I will include this in a future rewsletter. Send in any information you have on any of the Steelback and Leatherback wood and where you got it and particularly if you did like yours and how it fit. We need to know too where to buy good oak front seat wood frames. I thank Mr. Larson for sending the sketches, the photos and information on his wood.



An interesting item from a new member, Mr. William Bond of Evergreen, Co. Mr. Bond believes his Victoria belonged to

the gangsten Alvin Conpus. The entine body, inside doon panels, near quarter and kick panels had three inches of concrete put in up to the windows. There is a one half inch steel plate under the finewall. It also had a shielded (in pipe) secondary wining system. All this was for bullet proofing. All the front end and frame parts were re-enforced for strength. There were several other interesting installations and modifications to make the car go faster and handle better. I'd say Mr. Bond has an interesting Victoria.

Mike Annoyo of San Ramon, Ca. likes my pensonal card with the drawing of my Victoria on it. I am printing one here for you to see. Mike would like to know if I can have some done for the members. The answer is yes. The cost to me was \$22 for 500. If any of you want some cards made up, let me know. Before I have them printed, I'll get an exact price if it differs from what I quoted. The Victoria has many items that are different from other model A's and particular to the Victoria. Some of these items may be used on other models of the model A such as the A-400, Fordor Slant Windshield and others. There are a few that are particular to the Victoria only.

Outside of the body:

Outside metal header (over the windshield). (S.W.-4 dr). Windshield frame and glass. (S.W.-4dr). Top molding (Steelback) (S.W.-4dr). Top molding trim insert (Steelback) Rear spare time carrier Outside door handles - 68C, 160 A-B-C, 295-A, 400-A, 190-A Top material (Leatherback). Front bumper. Rear bumpered 31 S.W., 68-C, 400-A, 190-A (Long not Vickey). Rear bumperett brackets (from frame). Rear Fenders. 400-A, 190-A, S.W., 4-dr. Rear skirt (under body between fenders).

Inside of the body:

Windshield wiper motor. 190-A, S.W., 4-dr. Upholstery retainer (on header above windshield finished the same as window frames). yes. Windshield trim posts. Window frames. Window garnish molding, yes. Inside door handles. 190-A, 68-B-C, 160-B-C, 295A, 400-A Inside window handles. (same as above) Door handle and window handle bezels. (same as above) Dome light (complete). 190-A, 160 B-C. Dome light switch cover plate. (same as above). Steering wheel (tank) brace extension. Steering wheel post floor board cover plates.
Front carpet. Several slightly different.
Rear carpet. Same as above. Possibly 400-A, 2 dr. phaeton. Rean carpet riser (under rear seat). Rear floor pan. 190-A, 400-A, 2 dr. phaeton. tloon pan under rear seat (with hinges for seat back). 400-A? Front seats 190-A, 400-A, 2 dr. phaeton. Front seat brackets. (same as above). Rear seat. Rear seat back. Rean seat catch (male). 190-A, 400-A Rear seat catch (female). (same as above). Arm rests. Door sills (metal - left & right nailed to wood floor 12111. 1. 190-A, 400-A Door dovetails (female). 68-C, 190-A, 400-A. Door opener mechanisms. 190-A, 400-A.

Bright (interior) work finish (Butler). Inside of body continued.

All interior patterns. Quarter window shades. Headlinen.

Interior wood for Steelback. (Different from Leatherback). Interior wood for Leatherback. (Different from Steelback). Note: wood parts for the above two body styles are different and not interchangeable. It is recognized that some of the parts will interchange, it's best to order entire wood kit for the particular body you have. Wood sills and floor wood (interchangeable). Top wood (not interchangeable). Metal covers for door posts. Carpet snaps (types and locations). (Snap and button and snap and peened post). Refer to drawing in March 1987 news/ettern

and peened post . Refer to drawing in March 1987 newsletter. Inside Visors and brackets. 190-A, 160-B, C, 4 dr. S.W.

Assist strap brackets (vertical holes)

Front seat rear inner leg rest (metal bracket) Arm rest bracket.

Spare tire inner metal brace. Rubben body pads (no wood body blocks on a Victoria).
Rear view minron bracket (inside only - no outside minrons). Dome Light wood mounting plate (between rear bow and above rear window).

Judging standards say that the windshield wiper is black enamel with black clip. Clip should say TRICO PRODUCT, N.Y.

W/W blade, multi layer rubber with metal painted black.

W/W parks to the left.

Note: If anyone knows of any additions or mistakes in this list, please notify newsletter editor.

Where this list does not say, otherwise, the parts are only for the Victoria, (190-A).





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
